She spent 12 years working in the Ambulatory Department at the University of Medicine and Dentistry, where she served as a Nurse Manager. Her hard work and dedication led her to become the first African American Director of Nursing in the Medical Department, a remarkable achievement. In addition to her work in healthcare, Dr. McIntosh is also an instructor and educator. She teaches CPR and Health Aide Classes, helping students achieve their certification as Nursing Assistants. Her career reflects a strong commitment to both healthcare and education, and she continues to inspire others through her work and faith.
